Cannabis Attorneys of Michigan Statement Regarding Injunction Against LARA

Cannabis Attorneys of Michigan could not be prouder or more relieved that we were able defend our clients and other reputable medical cannabis license applicants against what was, in our opinion, an unconstitutional rule that could have resulted in criminal charges against many hitherto law-abiding citizens, and would have also most certainly resulted in widespread layoffs, bankruptcies, a massive infusion of marihuana into the black market and, most importantly, a lack of available safe medical cannabis to Michigan's patient population.

This nascent industry already faces significant challenges, and requires our state's support to become viable. While there may be applicants open and operating who may not ultimately qualify for a license, we have faith in the State's licensing and enforcement process that irresponsible operators will not survive in this highly-regulated industry. We encourage LARA and BMMR to also have faith that the unanticipated lag in the processing of applications is not a malicious act on the part of most applicants, but a symptom of a new and very expensive, highly complex and document-intensive licensing process that we are all trying to learn and work through.

Our Firm always considers legal action a last resort, and it is our sincere hope that, going forward, the state will work more closely in partnership with the medical cannabis industry toward a strong and viable network of responsible licensed businesses.


